Subject overview:

The aim of the ASDAN History Short course is to help pupils develop and demonstrate a range of skills through the different activities and studies. Also, it aims to provide opportunities for pupils to develop and demonstrate their understanding of history issues. The course also allows pupils to gain credit from what they have learnt from a wide range of activities both inside and outside of the classroom.

KS3:

The ASDAN History Short Course covers a range of topics are covered and accreditation is achieved by completing a minimum of five challenges relating to the module.

The modules covered include Local History, British History, Britain the Empire and the World, History from Below, European History and History in the World.

Our pupils are actively challenged to take charge of their own learning, with regular opportunities to complete independent research-based tasks in relation to the challenges set. The course focuses on some Key Historical Skills including: Evidence, Continuity and Change, Significance, Interpretations, Diversity, Chronology and Enquiry. Pupils also develop skills including teamwork, coping with problems, technology, English and mathematics.

KS4:

We build on the work of KS3 and continue with the ASDAN qualification as listed above.

Through history, we can learn how past societies, systems, ideologies, governments, cultures and technologies were built, how they operated, and how they have changed. The rich history of the world helps us to paint a detailed picture of where we stand today.

Developing a young person's knowledge of history means developing your knowledge of all these different aspects of life. All this knowledge makes pupils better prepared to learn in all their academic subjects.
