

## Maths

Investigating place value:  
Count, represent, write, order and compare numbers up to ten.  
Introduction to the Part - Whole Model. Use it to find number bonds to ten.

## Religious Education

Like how Superheroes can be special to people, pupils will explore who is special to them. Pupils will compare the qualities of their special person with those in the Christian, Islamic and the Hindu faith.

## History

To compare the heroic journeys of both Neil Armstrong and Christopher Columbus. Pupils will question and debate if these two historical figures are real life superheroes.

## Music

Pupils will use a variety of percussion instruments to represent the sounds a Superhero might make. They will make their own percussion instrument finding out how they work.

## Art

To bring some Pop to their art in the style of Andy Warhol. Pupils will create their own self portrait inspired by the pop art movement.

## Design and Technology

Pupils to use everyday materials to design and make their own space rocket.  
They will use paper Mache to create a 3D model of the moon. Using their rocket they will be able to BLAST OFF and visit the moon.
