

Maths

Addition and subtraction. Pupils will engage with the Part - Whole model and use base 10 and ones to support and represent their understanding of the number sentence.

Shape. Pupils will explore both 2D and 3D shapes.

Religious Education

Festivals will be at the heart of this term's learning. Pupils will share their own experiences of cultural or religious festivals as well as learning about those in the Christian, Muslim, Jewish and Hindu Faith.

History

To explore the events leading up to, during and after the Great Fire of London. As part of this topic pupils will also find out about the gruesome life in the 17th Century.

Music

Pupils will be introduced to the recorder. They will use the recorder to play simple well known tunes such as London's Burning.

Art

To use Vincent Van Gogh's painting of Starry Night as inspiration for our own starry night city landscape painting.

Design and Technology

Pupils to design and make a Stewart style wooden house, like the ones that burnt down during the Great Fire of London.
